Take Charge of Your Water Bill


It's no surprise that most customers use more water during the summer than the winter, and City Utilities must be able to meet that demand. Residential customers already have a pricing incentive to conserve during the summer.

Beginning October 2017, this pricing incentive will also be provided to commercial customers in their General Water Service Rate.


Take advantage of the greatest savings by managing your summer water use to an amount equal or less than your Winter Average.








Water units are measured in CCF. 1 CCF (hundred cubic feet) of water = 748 gallons



You will get the most savings by filling your pool or irrigating new landscaping outside of the Summer Period. Summer Billing Months—June through October



Saving Water Equals Savings To Your Business

TODAY your organization's City Utilities water bill includes a customer charge and a commodity charge. Commercial customers currently pay a flat rate based on the size of their water meter and the commodity charge is based on your water usage.

BEGINNING OCTOBER 17 your Winter Average (WA) usage will be calculated, and there will be various levels, or blocks, based on your WA that determines your rate. For summer months, the amount of water you use over your Winter Average will be billed at a higher rate.

Seasonal Water Service Changes

There will no longer be an advantage to disconnect your seasonal water service. If you request your permanent service to be temporarily discontinued for more than 24 hours and then reconnected within 12 months, a condition for reconnection will be payment of a charge equal to the customer charge over each billing month or part thereof that the disconnection was in effect.
